Dr. Stephen Pyne is Professor and Pyromantic at Arizona State University, Tempe, Arizona. Past President of the American Environmental History Association, he is the foremost historian of fire and is consulted by governments the world over for advice about environmental issues related to fire. His research interests focus on how people and nature interact. Dr. Pyne teaches courses on the history of exploration and environmental history, with a special enthusiasm for the history, ecology, and management of fire. His talk is based upon his forthcoming book surveying the Canadian fire regime.
