

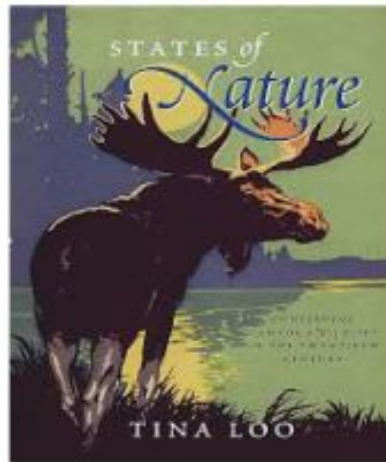

Her most recent book is *States of Nature: Conserving Canada’s Wildlife in the Twentieth Century* which was **awarded the Canadian Historical Association’s Sir John A. Macdonald Prize** for the best scholarly book in Canadian History in 2007 and the Harold Adams Innis Prize for the Best English-language book in the Social Sciences, awarded by the Canadian Federation for the Humanities and Social Sciences in 2008.
